In 1795, Calvert, a young friend, left him 900 pounds, and Wordsworth' resolved to devote himself to poetry as his life-work. Among his friends were Walter Scott 2, S.T Coleridge, Charles Lamb, Robert Southey, Rogers and Lord Lonsdale; and in 1845 he met Tennyson, whom he named "the first of our living poets". In 1843 after Southey's death, Wordsworth became Poet-Laureate. He died at Rydal Mount (his home since 1813), April 23, 1850, and was buried at Grasmere.</p>	25
